

The importance of listening

The role of active listening in understanding students' perspectives and experiences

- ✓ Builds trust and rapport
- ✓ Gains insight into students' needs and concerns
- ✓ Validates students' feelings and experiences
- ✓ Encourages open communication
- ✓ Tailoring feedback and support

- Enhances problem-solving and conflict resolution
- ✓ Improves classroom management
- ✓ Supports student **engagement** and learning
- ✓ Building a **safe space** for expression
- Addressing misunderstandings and misconceptions

Techniques for effective listening and understanding

- ✓ Maintain eye contact
- ✓ Use nonverbal cues
- ✓ Be patient
- ✓ Avoid interrupting
- ✓ Keep distractions at bay
- Create opportunities for student input
 - ✓ Stay neutral and open-minded
 - \checkmark Show interest and curiosity
 - ✓ Create a safe space for sharing
 - ✓ Ask open-ended questions



Techniques for effective listening and understanding - Online

- ✓ Establish Clear Communication Channels
- ✓ Schedule Virtual Office Hours
- ✓ Use Video and Audio
- ✓ Use Accessible Materials
- ✓ Monitor *Nonverbal Cues*
- ✓ Offer **Breakout** Sessions
- ✓ Create Opportunities for Student Input
- ✓ Ask for Written Feedback
- Establish an Inclusive Online Environment
- ✓ Be Attentive and Responsive

Examples of how active listening, understanding, and connecting can improve student engagement and trust.



Understanding students' needs



Building rapport





Explore the different needs and backgrounds of students and how to cater to them

- ✓ Understand diversity
- ✓ Need to know students' demographics
- ✓ <u>Get to know students</u> personally
- ✓ Host one-on-one meetings
- ✓ Observe student behavior and engagement
- ✓ Pay attention to group dynamics
- ✓ Use discussion forums and chat features
- Encourage student feedback
- ✓ Create <u>open communication</u> channels

- ✓ Offer surveys and check-ins
- Respect student privacy and confidentiality
- Create forums or chat channels where students can introduce themselves
- Encourage open discussions on platforms.
- ✓ Leverage Existing Support Systems



Recognize and address emotional, social, and academic needs

Strategies for recognizing and addressing emotional, social, and academic needs

- ✓ Observe student behavior
- ✓ Monitor online engagement
- ✓ <u>Listen</u> to student communication
- Monitor academic performance

- ✓ Provide access to resources
- ✓ Create an inclusive classroom environment
- ✓ Communicate openly
- ✓ Offer <u>flexibility</u> and accommodations

- ✓ Encourage social connections
- ✓ Check-in regularly
- \checkmark Work with support staff

Best practices and strategies for connecting with students

- ✓ Establish a **positive** classroom culture
- ✓ Share relatable stories and experiences
- ✓ Provide timely and <u>constructive feedback</u>
- ✓ Encourage open dialogue and participation
- ✓ Create opportunities for interaction
- ✓ Be flexible and *adaptable*
- ✓ <u>Build trust</u> through consistency
- ✓ Recognize and **celebrate diversity**



The benefits of building strong relationships with students





- Enhanced academic performance
- ✓ Increased student engagement
- ✓ Improved classroom behavior
- Greater emotional and social support
- ✓ Improved peer relationships
- ✓ <u>Higher levels of trust</u> and communication

- Positive impact on the student's well-being
- ✓ High levels of student and graduate <u>satisfaction</u>
- ✓ Greater retention and graduation rates
