Pontificia Universidad Católica de Puerto Rico



La Pontificia Universidad Católica se fundó en 1948 por iniciativa de los obispos S.E.R. Mons. James E. McManus, C.S.S.R., obispo de la Diócesis de Ponce y S.E.R. James Davis, obispo de la Diócesis de San Juan, Puerto Rico. A finales de su primer año de fundación, la Universidad obtuvo la acreditación del Consejo de Educación Superior de Puerto Rico. En 1953 fue acreditada por la *Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools*. A su vez, todos los programas académicos de la Pontificia Universidad Católica están acreditados por el Consejo General de Educación, la Sagrada Congregación de Educación Católica en Roma y por diversas asociaciones profesionales, tales como: *Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN)*, the *National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Sciences*, the *Council on Social Work Education*, y el *American Bar Association*.

En 1960 se fundó el recinto de Arecibo por la Congregación de los Padres del Espíritu Santo, con el propósito de ofrecer la oportunidad de una educación universitaria a los habitantes de la Diócesis y Región Educativa de Arecibo. El recinto de Mayagüez comenzó como una extensión de lo que era la Pontificia Universidad Católica de Puerto Rico. Esta ofrecía cursos básicos a una población adulta que tomaba clases en las tardes. Fue oficialmente nombrado centro de la PUCPR en 1982. El 25 de enero de 1991 se le confirió el título de Pontificia. Esta nueva distinción ratifica, de manera oficial, la autenticidad de la Universidad Católica de Puerto Rico como institución de la Iglesia Católica.

En la actualidad continúa sirviendo con programas innovadores y variados a la población del oeste de Puerto Rico. La Misión de la Pontificia Universidad Católica de Puerto Rico es celebrar y promover la vida y la dignidad de la persona humana y educarla, según los valores del Evangelio, en las disciplinas del conocimiento científico actualizado para construir un mejor mundo local y global.

Actualmente, la Pontificia Universidad Católica de Puerto Rico sirve a estudiantes jóvenes y adultos de distintos credos, razas, nacionalidades y niveles económicos ofreciendo grados asociados, carreras cortas, maestrías, doctorados y educación continua. Igualmente, ofrecen más de 160 programas a nivel subgraduado para preparar profesionales capacitados para las exigencias del mundo laboral y programas binarios en las áreas de medicina, quiropráctica, veterinaria, salud pública, ciencias biomédicas y farmacia con reconocidas universidades en Puerto Rico, el Caribe y los Estados Unidos.

The Pontifical Catholic University was founded in 1948 on the initiative of Bishops James E. McManus, C.S.S.R., bishop of the Diocese of Ponce, and James Davis, bishop of the Diocese of San Juan, Puerto Rico. At the end of its first year, the University obtained accreditation from the Puerto Rico Council on Higher Education. In 1953, it was accredited by the *Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools*. In turn, all academic programs at the Pontifical Catholic University are accredited by the General Council of Education, the Sacred Congregation of Catholic Education in Rome, and various professional associations, such as: the Accreditation

Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN), the National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Sciences, the Council on Social Work Education, and the American Bar Association.

In 1960, the Arecibo campus was founded by the Congregation of the Holy Spirit Fathers, with the purpose of offering the opportunity for a university education to the inhabitants of the Diocese and Educational Region of Arecibo. The Mayagüez campus began as an extension of what was then the Pontifical Catholic University of Puerto Rico. It offered basic courses to an adult population that took classes in the afternoons. It was officially named a center of the PUCPR in 1982. On January 25, 1991, it was conferred the title of Pontifical. This new distinction officially ratifies the authenticity of the Catholic University of Puerto Rico as an institution of the Catholic Church.

Today, it continues to serve the population of western Puerto Rico with innovative and varied programs. The mission of the Pontifical Catholic University of Puerto Rico is to celebrate and promote the life and dignity of the human person and to educate them, according to the values of the Gospel, in the disciplines of up-to-date scientific knowledge in order to build a better local and global world.

Currently, the Pontifical Catholic University of Puerto Rico serves young and adult students of different faiths, races, nationalities, and economic levels, offering associate degrees, short courses, master's degrees, doctorates, and continuing education. It also offers more than 160 undergraduate programs to prepare professionals for the demands of the working world and dual programs in the areas of medicine, chiropractic, veterinary medicine, public health, biomedical sciences, and pharmacy with renowned universities in Puerto Rico, the Caribbean, and the United States.
